DID YOU HEAR?

The historic Al. Ringling Theatre in Baraboo was donated to the Wisconsin Historical Society last month, along with \$3.07 million for transition costs and an operating endowment. The 700-seat theatre was built in 1915 by Al Ringling, co-founder of the world-renowned Ringling Brothers Circus, and was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1976.
