


### **Law:** National Historic Preservation Act

- Created the Federal Preservation program in 1966
- Authorizes the National Register of Historic Places as a planning tool
- Established a protective review process for historic sites impacted by Federal involvement Section 106
- Requires Federal agencies to identify and inventory historic sites – Section 110
- Established a system of State Historic Preservation Officers
- As Amended established the Historic Preservation Fund (1977), CLG, THPOs, and Tax Incentive program

## Historic Preservation Fund (HPF) Non-competitive grant programs

- Think annual BLOCK grant!
- HPF Grants to fund State Historic Preservation Offices
  - Annual grants awarded to 50 states, the District of Columbia, and 8 Territories
  - 10% of funding directed to Certified Local Governments (\$4.5 5 million)
- HPF Grants to fund Tribal Historic Preservation
   Offices
  - Annual grants awarded to over 200 Tribes

#### Certified Local Government Program

Preservation through Partnership: this is the goal of the Certified Local Government (CLG) Program. Local, State, and Federal governments work together in the Federal Preservation Program to help communities save the irreplaceable historic character of places. Through the certification process, communities make a local commitment to historic preservation. This commitment is key to America's ability to preserve, www.nps.gov/clg protect, and increase awareness of our unique cultural heritage found in the built environment across the country.

#### How

Jointly administered by the National Park Service (NPS) and the State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPOs), each local community works through a certification process to become recognized as a Certified Local Government (CLG). Once certified CLGs become an active partner in the Federal Historic Preservation Program. . Each community gains access to benefits of the program and agrees to follow required Federal and State requirements. The How To Become a CLG page will help you get started.














#### Albany, GA Art Contest



   & hosts annual dinner on the bridge









- •2007 Santa Fe Passenger and Freight Complex Rehabilitation plan (Preserve America \$20,000)
- 2009 Rehabilitate (and raise) Complex to save from future flooding (\$3.2 million)
- Support to conserve artifacts damaged in flooding (IMLS)
- 2008 Survey of Old Town residential district (HRDP/SHPO
- 2009 rejoined Main Street
- 2011 Intensive Survey of Old Town district (HRDP/SHPO)
- •2012 \$500,000 in CDBG/HUD funding for Main Street facade improvements
- Used small City funds and in-kind as match







  - FY2016 \$8 million
  - FY2017 \$13 million
  - FY2018 \$13 million
  - FY2019 \$14.5 million
  - FY2020 \$15.5 million
- Applications due December 2020

- Grants to preserve sites
   related to all Americans
   struggle for equal rights.
- No match required
- Projects types include preservation.
- FY2020 \$2.5 million
- Applications due December 2020

Eligible applicants include
 States, Tribes, local
 governments, and non-profit
 organizations.



## Historically Black Colleges & Universities

- Grants to assist HBCUs
   repairing National Register
   listed buildings on their
   campuses
- Over \$40 million awarded through 2006 and since refunded:
  - FY2017 \$4 million
  - FY2018 \$5 million
  - FY2019 \$8 million
  - FY2020 \$10 million
- Applications due Winter2021
- No match required

### Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grants

- Physical preservation of NRHP listed and eligible sites that can encourage economic development.
- Awarded as block grants to be subgranted.
  - FY2018 \$5 million
  - FY2019 \$5 million
  - FY2020 \$7.5 million
- No match required
- Funds must be spent in rural areas> 50,000 as defined:
  - https://www.census.gov/quickfacts
- FY2020 due Winter 2021

### Save America's Treasures

- Established as part of the millennium
- For the preservation and conservation of nationally significant buildings and collections in partnership with NEA, NEH, and IMLS.
- From 1999 to 2010 over 3,600 applications requested \$1.45 billion.
- \$300+ million to over 1,200 projects since 1999.
- Projects funded in all 50 states,DC, and the territories.

### Save America's Treasures

- Eligible applicants include states, tribes, local governments, and non-profits.
- 1:1 nonfederal match required.
- Since re-funded:
  - FY2017 \$5 million
  - FY2018 \$13 million
  - FY2019 \$13 million
  - FY2020 \$16 million
- Applications due in December 2020
- NPS manages building projects and IMLS manages collections projects.

### **Tribal Heritage**

- Since 1990 more than \$17
  million has been awarded
  to over 460 Indian, Alaskan
  Native, and Native Hawaiian
  communities.
- Grants to assist in protecting and promoting unique cultural heritage and traditions.
- No match required.
- Applications for at least \$500,000 in funding due
   Winter 2021.

 Projects include: oral histories, survey and inventory, education, interpretation, and preservation.

- Funds surveys of historic properties associated with underrepresented communities, as well as nominations to the National Register for specific sites.
- \$25-50,000 awards
- No match required
- \$750,000 available in 2020
- Applications due Winter 2021.
- SHPOs, THPOs, CLGs may apply

# ESHPF: Emergency Supplemental Historic Preservation Fund for Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, Maria

- Grants to assist disaster affected States and Tribes
- Used for staffing support for 106, repair of storm damage, survey and disaster planning.
- \$50 million awarded each to:
  - Katrina
  - Sandy
  - Harvey, Irma, Maria
  - Florence, Yutu, Michael
