Behind the Scenes, Beneath the Beams: Wisconsin History Center Taking Shape

Big things are happening on Capitol Square and behind the scenes as progress continues on the future [Wisconsin History Center](#)! Behind the construction fences, the site is starting to take form with the concrete foundation poured and the tower crane installed and ready to raise beams!

Meanwhile, Society staff members and agency partners are deep in planning and design for the five-story, 116,000-square-foot facility. The center will feature three core galleries, a large changing gallery, a community gallery and vibrant field trip and communal spaces that will welcome and inspire visitors from all 72 Wisconsin counties and beyond.

Earlier this summer, we were thrilled to share that the design and construction of the Wisconsin History Center is fully funded thanks to generous support from the Administration, state legislators and hundreds of private donors.


