## 2023 HIGHLIGHTS

2023 has been a year of great momentum and many highlights at the Wisconsin Historical Society. We continue to expand the ways we are collecting, preserving and sharing history with people across all 72 counties and have made incredible strides in the design of the new Wisconsin History Center.


**None of this would be possible without your continued support and collaboration, so we wanted to take a moment to celebrate our mutual success.**

The Society contributed lasting impacts to our state's economic, educational, and cultural health through a range of unique programs and initiatives. We stewarded a **147%** increase in student titles and textbooks distributed by the Society Press to kids across the state, drove a **45%** bump in attendance at historic sites and museums across the state, and so much more:

- **53,896** Wisconsin students used the Society's 4th-grade history textbook (**23%** increase)
- **2,818** students from **60** schools visited the new History Maker Space on Capitol Square
- **60,635** people reached by travelling exhibitions; **17,952** participated in Society presentations
- **473** consultations with affiliated local history organizations across Wisconsin and **185** local governments served via in-person consultations with Society Staff

We also shared a sneak peek in June at the progress being made on the [Wisconsin History Center](#). If you haven't had the chance to check out the flythrough video yet, take a look below and stay tuned in the new year for more history center updates as we prepare for demolition and groundbreaking in 2024.


