# IMPACT ON WISCONSIN

In 2025, the Wisconsin Historical Society made major contributions to Wisconsin's economic, educational, and cultural health through innovative initiatives and programs.

## **EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS**

- **57,000 students** used the Society's 4th-grade textbook
- **6.000 students** participated in NHD (42% increase) from 82 schools
- 32,981 K-12 students engaged with history at our 12 historic sites & museums (23% increase)
- **8,146 student titles & textbooks** sold by the Wisconsin Historical Society Press
- **4,306 students** served in sessions at the History Makers Space at US Bank Plaza
- 61 students qualified for National History Day Finals in Washington D.C.
- **37,918 books** sold by the Society Press, many printed on Wisconsin paper

## STATEWIDE SERVICE & NATIONAL REACH

- 209,322 people visited our 12 historic sites and museums
- **261,509 combined followers** on all Society's social media channels (13% increase)
- 4.1 million unique visits (page views) among all Society websites (wisconsinhistory.org)
- 218,494 patrons served by the Society's Library & Archives
- **10,685 active members** of the Wisconsin Historical Society (2,985 new members)
- **369 attendees** participated in the Society's local history conference
- 40,311 people reached by traveling exhibitions; 10,113 attended Society presentations
- 459 consultations held by outreach staff to support affiliated local history organizations
- 14 new state historical markers installed across Wisconsin

## PRIVATE INVESTMENT, JOBS & RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- \$11.4 million of the Society's \$35.5 million in total revenue (32%) came from private gifts, endowments, earned and service revenue and \$2.3 million in federal grant awards
- 1,113 projected jobs created by construction projects related to historic tax credit programs
- \$63.9 million invested in rehabilitated historic properties across Wisconsin
- \$8.8 million awarded in federal historic preservation tax credits
- 237 buildings rehabilitated using tax credit programs
- \$30 million in private funds raised for the Society by the Wisconsin Historical Foundation (WHF)
- \$22.3 million in private funds raised by WHF for the Wisconsin History Center (\$53.2 million total)
- \$4.5 million in earned revenue from WHS admissions, retail sales, event rentals, etc.
- \$800,133 in earned revenue from retail sales at WHS online store and gift shops
- \$551,025 in Society Press book sales, thanks in part to 9 new titles published
