Get Started Today

Get ahead of potential issues by looking and thinking forwardly.

First, ask yourself why you collect. What do you truly value?

Then, develop a collecting guide or refine existing guide/scope/policy.

Provenance vs. type specimen

Story vs. connoisseurship

Consider local or regional identity as the major collecting guidepost.

Collecting 'calculus' = collecting mission + limited resources + risk management + donor expectations

Express genuine thanks.

Communicate realities and set expectations.

Share your mission as well as your process.

Declining is a core responsibility of proper curation.

It must be careful, considerate, and communicated.

Front-end effort, by you and donors, helps to winnow and ultimately yields a better collection.
