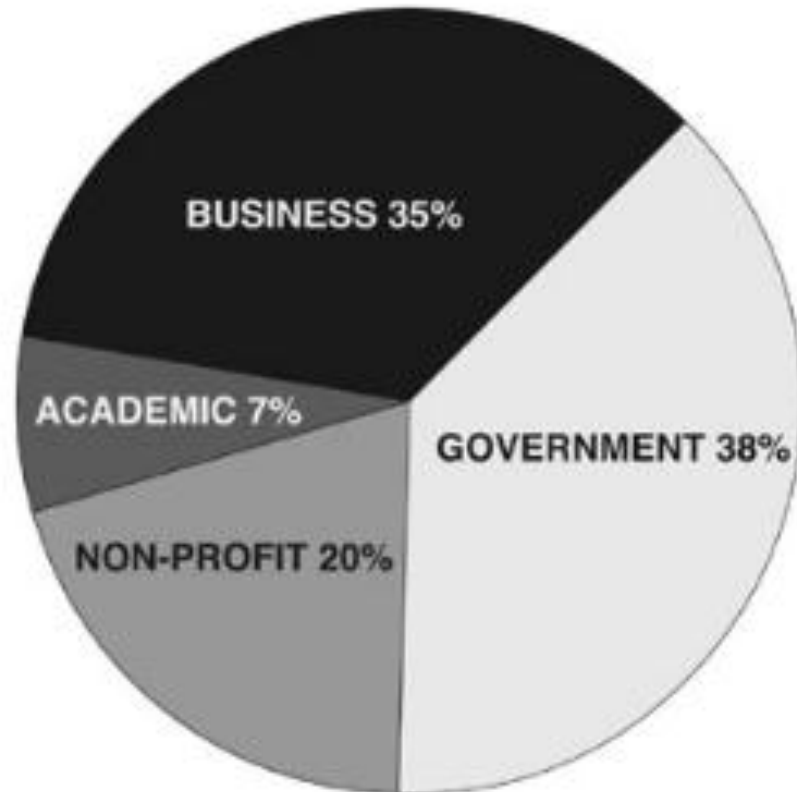

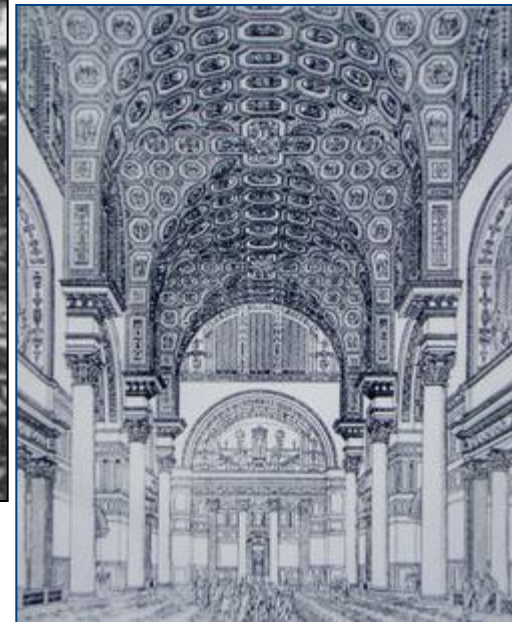

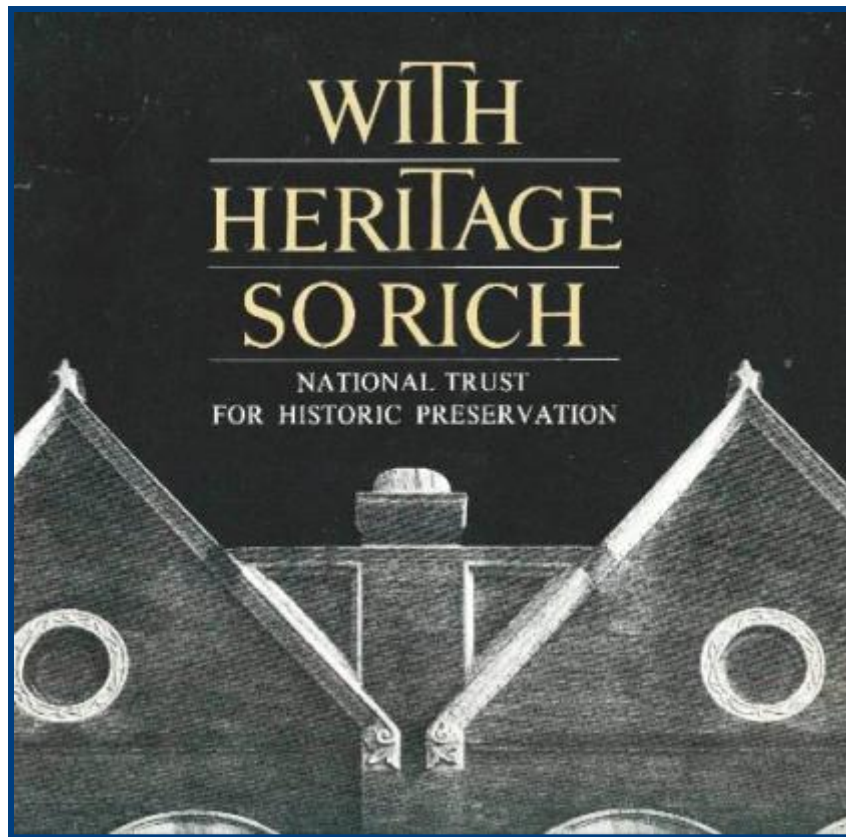

Historic Preservation Fund (HPF)

National Historic Preservation Act of 1966



- Provided funding to each State/Territory to create a State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)
 - Each of the fifty states, eight territories and Wash DC now have SHPOs (59)
 - 1980 - 10% of state's funding made available to Certified Local Governments (68 in WI)
 - 1992 – Separate budget line available to Tribal Historic Preservation Offices (9 in WI)

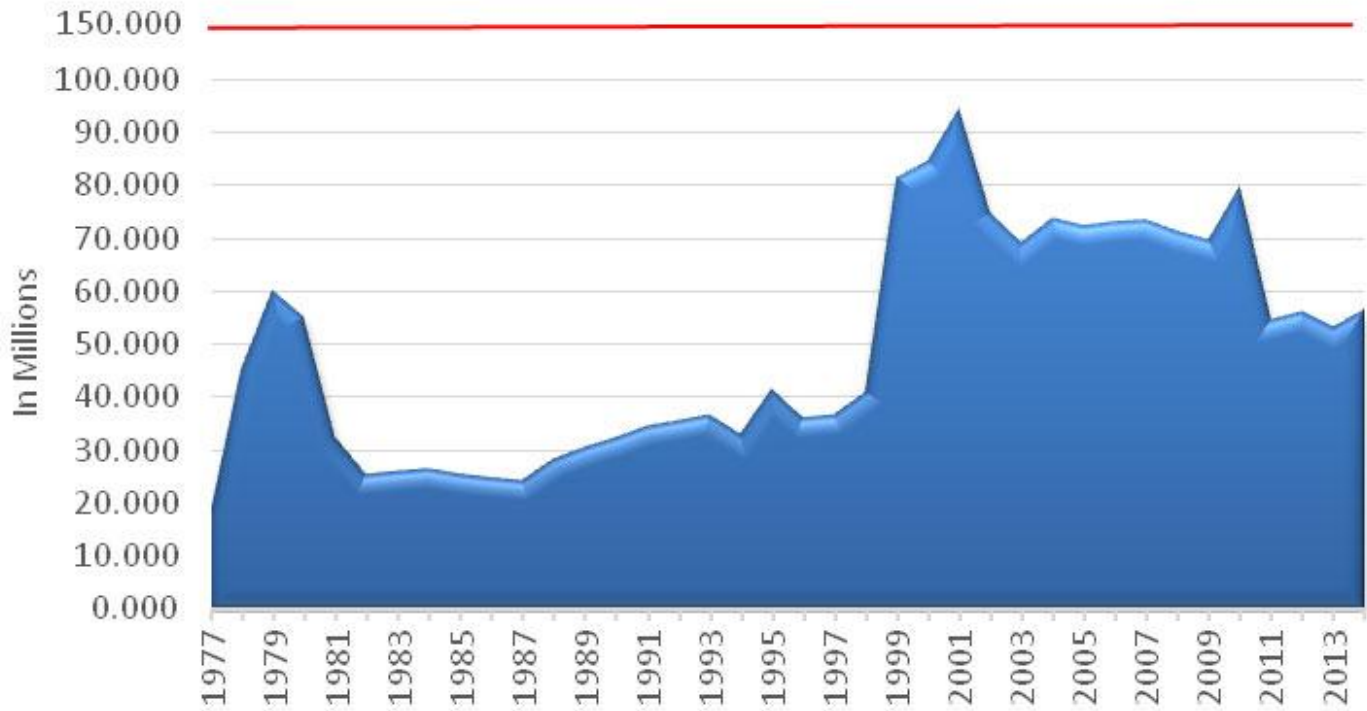

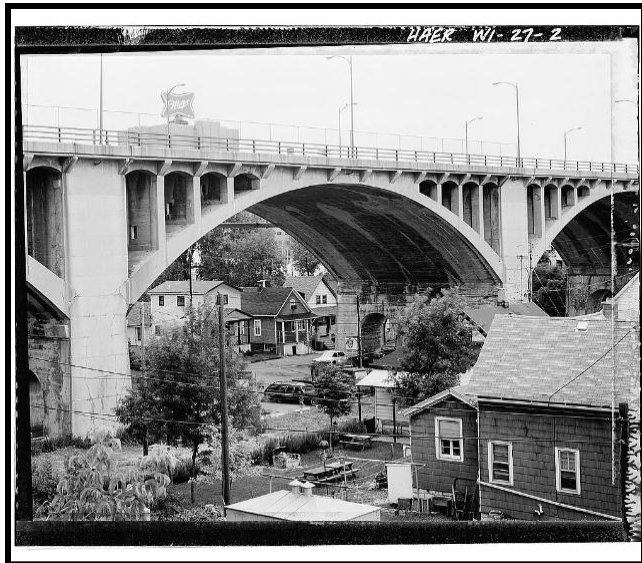

FEMA Issues Call for Historic Preservation Specialists

September 9, 2005—Beginning immediately under an expedited process, FEMA is hiring 15-20 Historic Preservation Specialists to work as part of FEMA's environmental and historic preservation cadre of reservists (Disaster Assistance Employees, or DAEs). This is on-call employment, but due to Hurricane Katrina, there are immediate needs for these specialists. Copied [below](#) is a general job description with required knowledge, skills and abilities and job responsibilities while in the field. Under this position, FEMA has various specialties, including archaeologists, architectural historians, historic preservation trainers, preservation architects, Section 106 specialists, and tribal/cultural specialists.

FEMA employees may be subject to 24-hour on-call in the event of an emergency. This service may require irregular working hours, work at locations other than the official duty station, and may duties other than those specified in the employee's official position description. Selectees must be able to relocate to emergency sites with little advance notice and function under intense physical and mental stress.

Please feel free to also inform Angela Caldwell (202/646-3193, Angela.Gladwell@dhs.gov) that you have submitted an application and she will do her best to keep track of where it is in the process.

1. Indication that you are seeking a position as a Disaster Assistance Employee in the Environmental and Historic Preservation Cadre as an Historic Preservation Specialist;





The Sally Kress Tompkins Fellowship, a joint program of the Society of Architectural Historians (SAH) and the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), permits a graduate student in architectural history of a related field to work on a 12-week HABS project during the summer. The Fellow will either conduct research on a nationally significant building or site and prepare a written history to become part of the permanent HABS collection, or conduct research on a particular topic relating to architectural history in support of future HABS projects. The Fellow will be stationed in the field working in conjunction with a HABS measured drawings team, or in the HABS Washington, D.C. office. Recipients are also required to upload a minimum of 50 images to SAH's SAHARA image database.

AWARD STIPEND



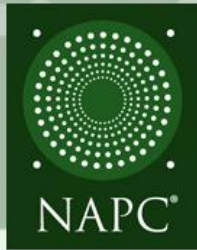
Bringing preservation "home"




