Junior Individual & Group Documentary Students: there will be a LIVE final round in your event. Final Round finalists will be announced at the Information Desk. If you are a final round finalist, **YOU** (or at least 1 of your group members) must be present to play your documentary. There will not be an interview in final rounds.

***We ask that you do not enter or exit a room while a film or performance is underway. Judges should open the door during the interviews and setup/takedown; during this time, you can quietly exit and enter.**

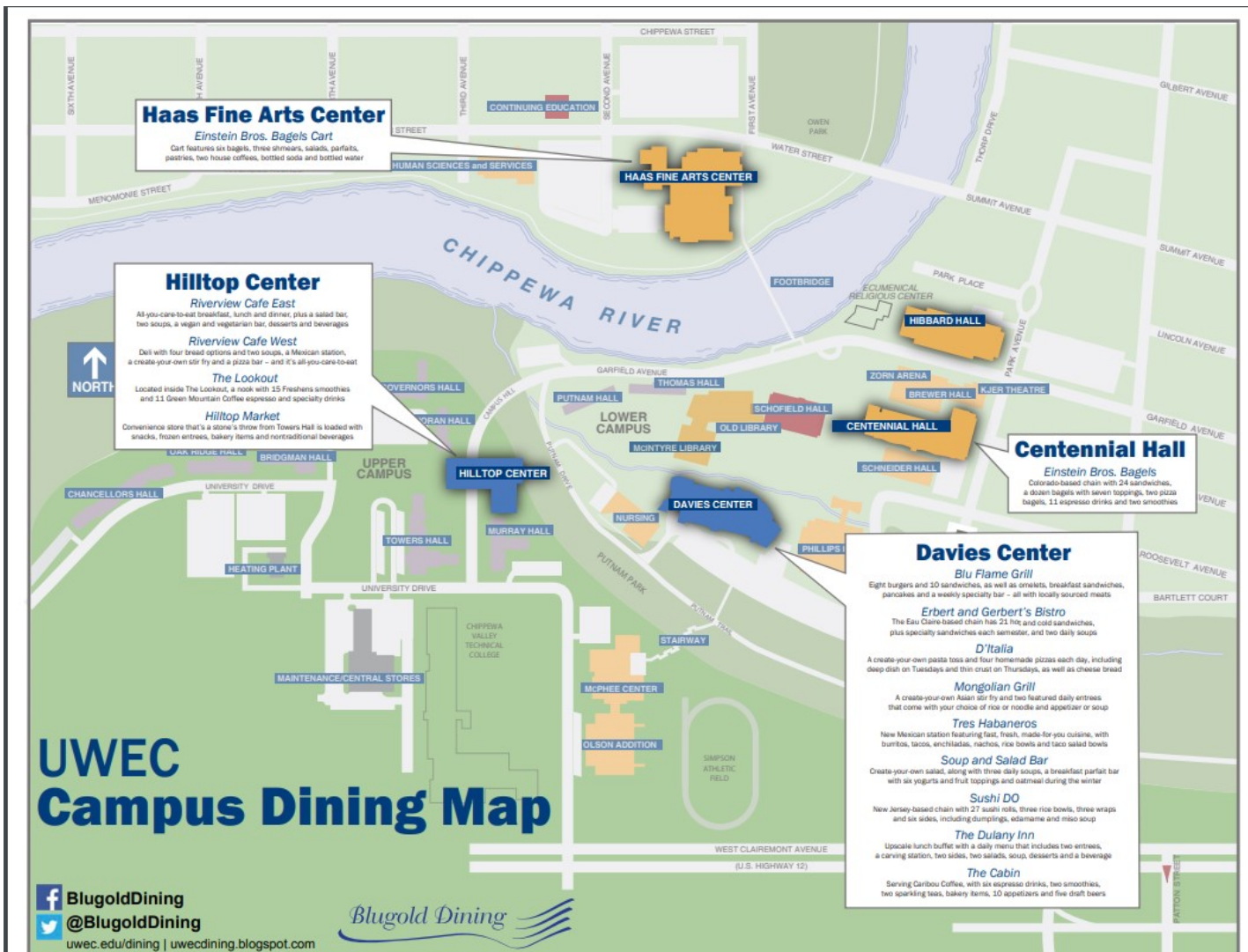

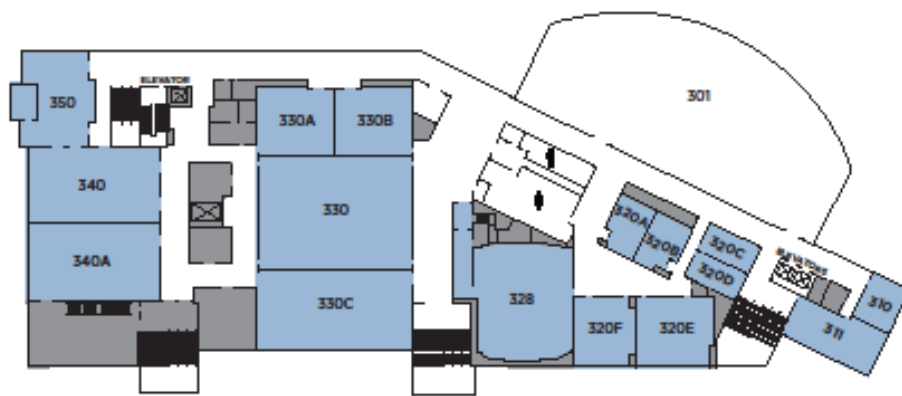

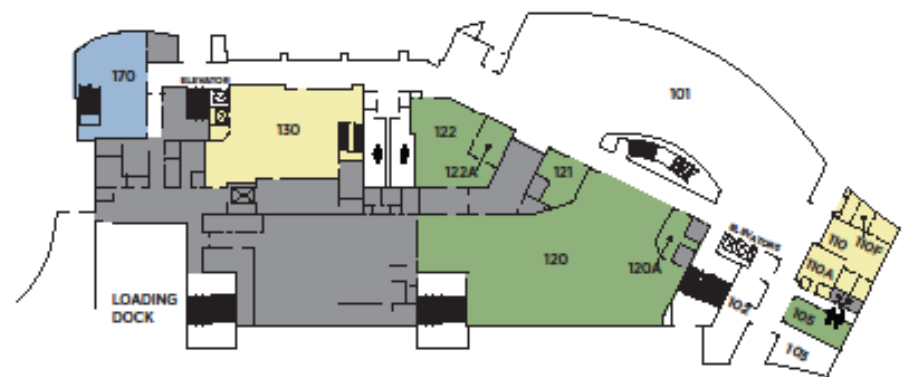
