
OPEN TO THE PUBLIC!

- Finals Rounds — closed; no students or public during Finals judging

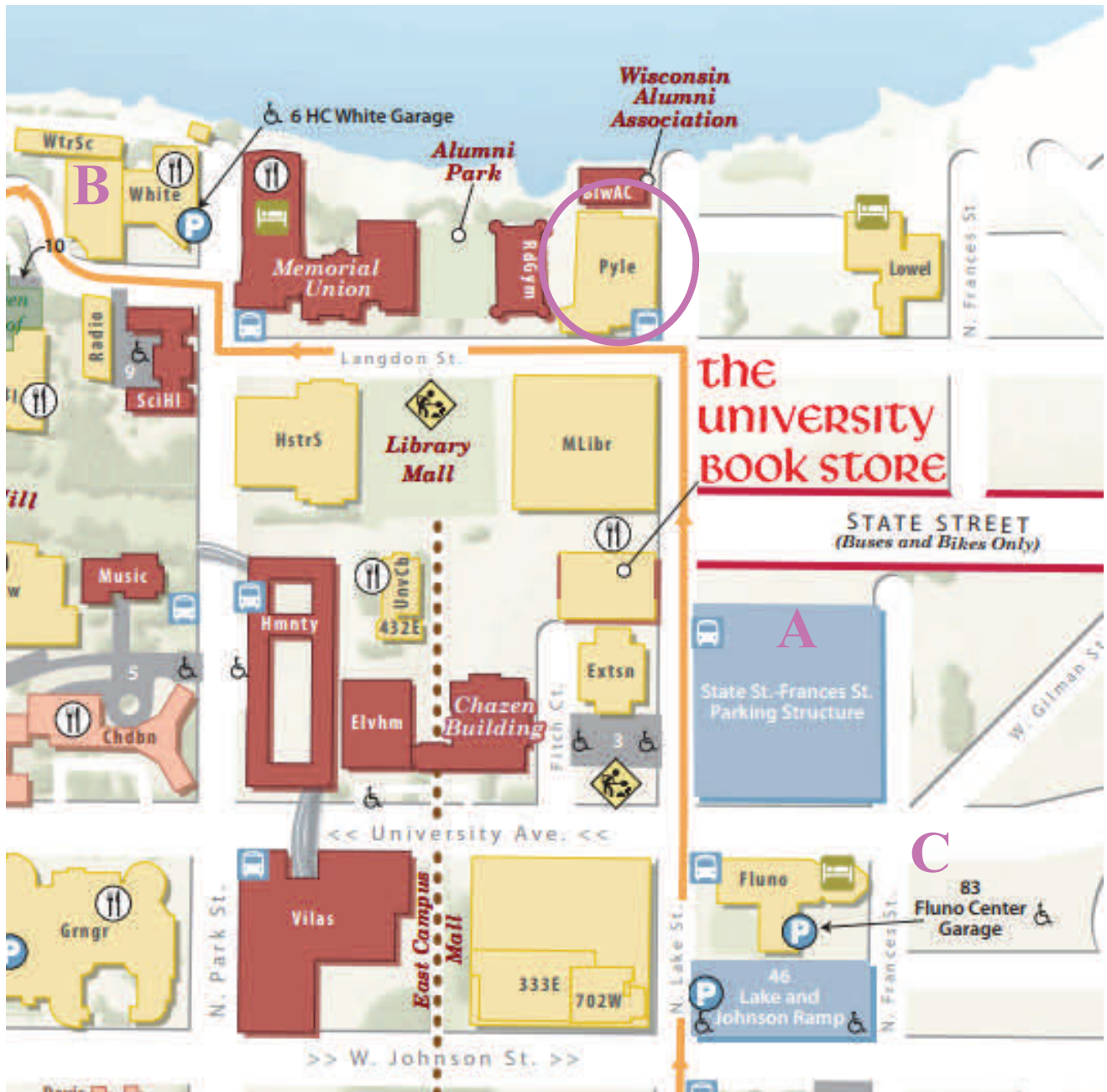
